
I know for our family the Mission Gift Market is always a wonderful time to connect with various ministries we hear about throughout the year and help them as they serve their communities.

CEF is a worldwide organization devoted to reaching children in over 190 countries (12 million children were reached worldwide By 2,800 full time workers and +/- 120,000 volunteers) with the love and Message of Jesus Christ. Since 1966, boys and girls have come to know Jesus personally in not only the three official languages of Belgium (French, Flemish, and German) but also in English due to the thousands of internationals. Adults have also been trained in how to bring God's Word to children in a clear and creative way. Boys and girls and even their families are coming into a living relationship with the Lord Jesus through after school Bible clubs, holiday clubs, and camps. These children are from very different family backgrounds including: refugees and immigrants, those from embassy parents, military parents, those with international businesses, and of course, those from Belgian families. ## La Jolla English Language Center

The La Jolla English Language Center offers adult literacy tutoring and English as a Second Language (ESL) classes on Tuesday evenings from 7-8:30pm at La Jolla Presbyterian Church. A non-profit organization run by a director and volunteer tutors, the Center is dedicated to helping adults, adolescents, and children learn to speak, read and write English to improve and enrich their lives and, in turn, San Diego communities. The tutors teach foreign-born students in small groups to develop better comprehension, confidence and fluency. The students want to learn English to become more helpful parents, to communicate more effectively with their employers and community, to aid in looking for a job or better job and acquire citizenship. The classes are free and the costs for books and class materials are subsidized by donations. The La Jolla English Language Center is a member of the Laubach Literacy Council of San Diego County and is affiliated with Laubach/Proliteracy America and Worldwide.

Reality Changers builds first generation college students who follow God's Word. Most inner-city students today know more people who have been shot or killed than people are on the road to college. Reality Changers aims to accomplish one thing: create a safe community by building first generation college students.

Reality Changers serves over 500 low-income, inner-city students. Members attend weekly three-hour programs consisting of SAT workshops, inspirational lessons, leadership seminars, and one on one tutoring. [www.realitychangers.org](http://www.realitychangers.org)

Reality Changers awards **\$3,500** scholarships for students with a 3.5 GPA or above to attend UCSD's Academic Connections, a three-week residential program where students take college-level courses for credit, learning they can succeed at a university. Students who earn 2,000 "points" during the weekly SAT workshops earn a **\$400** scholarship to Forest Home Summer Camp where they strengthen their commitment to the program, one another, themselves and God.

# UPLIFT/Kids at Heart

**UPLIFT (URBAN PEOPLE LIVING IN FAITH AND TRUST)** was founded in 1987 by the Reverend Burton Smith. UPLIFT is a Christian ministry; four programs with one purpose: to provide hope for a better tomorrow for some of the inner city's most vulnerable populations. Each year, we share the gift of God's love and grace with some 300 children, teens, seniors and homeless through one of UPLIFT's programs. **Kids at Heart** offers one-on-one tutoring and mentoring for at-risk students, grades K-12. **Senior Partners Plus** provides fellowship and group activities for downtown seniors. **Triple Cross** provides transportation for the homeless seeking reintegration into the working world. **Swimming Upstream**, through a 15-week, 4 year leadership workshop program, provides teen women with the tools of Godly character and personal discipline they need to succeed.



Volunteer tutors work one-on-one with inner-city students to complete homework assignments and improve reading skills once a week for an academic traditional school year. The tutors are role models to the children in a Christian environment, allowing them to realize their full potential and recognizing that individual responsibility promotes solid relationships in the community.

## SunHouse Mission Outreach Spring Break Project



Each year students from SunHouse take the opportunity over spring break to go to Mexico and build a house for a needy family. This last year we built a house for a family that was living in a house made from old garage doors. They had a piece of plywood as a front door with a large chain as a lock, and tarps covering some holes in the roof. Our students showed up to a concrete foundation and quickly got to work. Within the first day, the framing was almost completely done and the days that followed students installed electrical wiring, roofing, drywall, windows, doors, and paneling. The students built the house in three and half days and were able to give the keys to this family of five. Lives were changed for both the family and our students.



We also introduced the students to evangelism, going into a community and inviting locals to come hear the gospel. Three of our students shared their testimony, with it being translated into Spanish, and 50 people committed their lives to Jesus that day. It was amazing!

This year we are hoping to build two houses and have twice the number of students experience this transformational experience. Your purchase of a Christmas ornament from the SunHouse table goes to one of SunHouse's mission trips. We also use these funds to help students go to Malawi, Africa and Belize, Central America.

Service and going into the world to serve are such vital and necessary components to the spiritual development of students. We are grateful for all the support and help we receive from the congregation. The mission of SunHouse is to help students and families learn to Love God, Serve People and Change the World.

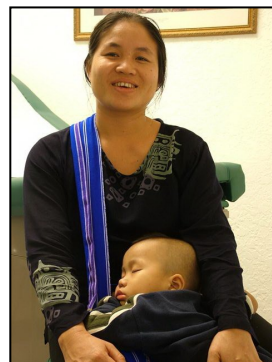
**Alliance for African Assistance** is a non-profit agency founded in 1989 by Walter Lam, a Ugandan refugee and member of LJPC, to help fellow refugees resettling in San Diego. The Alliance now has approximately 40 staff members representing 17 different countries. The Alliance will resettle more than 1,000 refugees this year, providing over 20 types of services to lead them toward self-sufficiency. Pray for homes for the hundreds of thousands of refugees in camps around the world. Pray for resources so the Alliance can continue to meet the needs of refugees in San Diego. Pray for world peace so that people will never again be forced to flee their homelands.

## Alliance Health Clinic

With support from LJPC, the Alliance Health Clinic opened in August 2007 to provide primary care for refugees and other medically underserved multi-cultural families. Since then, over 2,500 patients have been treated.

The clinic gives refugees a medical home that understands their circumstance and respects their cultural values and traditions. Walter Lam, a Ugandan refugee and a member of LJPC, is the President/CEO of the clinic.

Because of the large number of refugees being resettled in California, it takes at least two months for new arrivals to gain access to the Medi-Cal benefits that reimburse the clinic for services required by the U.S. State Department within thirty days of arrival. The costs of life-saving prescription medications which the clinic provides before Medi-Cal "kicks in" are not recoverable and are draining the clinic's resources. recoverable and are draining the clinic's resources.

## Adopt A Refugee Family—A LJPC Christmas Tradition



Consider spending Christmas in a foreign country where you had limited understanding of the language and limited resources. Where you didn't have friends or extended family.

That's a reality for newly arrived refugees in San Diego. When refugees come to the United States, they may have nothing more than the clothes they are wearing. They receive limited financial aid for eight months. In that time, some of the challenges they face are learning to speak, read, and write English, finding a job, learning to drive, and helping their children in school. Most have had little formal education.

Women head many of the households because their husbands were killed in war, and the women and children have fled to safety. They often wait years in refugee camps before receiving permission to come to the United States. They are joyful to arrive, but overwhelmed by learning how to live in a culture radically different than their own.

You can give the gift of Christmas celebration. Contact information and brief descriptions of the refugee families and their needs will be available at the Adopt a Family table at the Mission Gift Market and in the patio during December. Please stop and find a refugee family that you, your family, or your group can adopt for Christmas.

**Who We Are:** Ladle Fellowship is a ministry of First Presbyterian Church, San Diego to the homeless and poor in the downtown area. **What We Do:** (1) We serve a hot meal and offer a worship service each Sunday afternoon that is attended primarily by San Diego's urban poor and homeless. (2) We distribute food bags once a month to low-income seniors and needy veterans. We provide groceries for needy military families once a month. (3) We assist needy individuals in their job searches and offer valuable work experience and references through on-going volunteer opportunities. (4) We offer on-going pastoral care and counseling with a focus on re-uniting fragmented families, restoring broken relationships, and establishing a life committed to purpose. (5) We make available sober living and case managed transitional housing to those committed to getting off and staying off the streets. (6) We gather weekly for a Practical discipleship class with an emphasis on helping the homeless and others become committed lifelong followers of Jesus Christ through the study of Scripture and its practical application.

## Military Outreach Ministries

**SDMOM** is faith based public charity supported by churches, businesses and private donors working in partnership with other non-profit organizations. With a small paid staff of military wives and hundreds of volunteers, each year, SDMOM helps thousands of enlisted families who are far from home with services like baby showers, new mom hospital visits, assistance to wounded service members and their families and many other family and holiday events. All services are provided free of charge to enlisted military families of all faiths.

Each year, volunteers assist with setting up our holiday toy stores for 800 families. Volunteers help in our warehouse at Miramar East, Marine Corps Air Station, sorting children's' clothing, preparing diaper packs, boxing dish packs, assembling welcome

bags, checking and stacking food cans, and packing food bags for weekly distribution. Volunteers represent our sponsor churches (such as LJPC) on our steering committee and in the community.

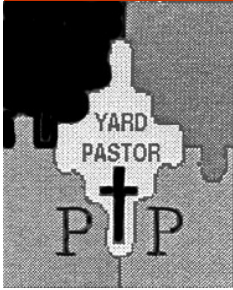

## PASTORS TO PRISONERS

Pastors to Prisoners provides "yard pastors" to assist Protestant institutional prison chaplains. The task of ministering to at least 5000 men held in five enclosures within the prison is a challenge that allows for the chaplain to spend two to three hours a week on each enclosure conducting inmate worship services, Bible studies, one-on-one counseling and mentoring, and supervising other chapel programs. A meaningful ministry is next to impossible without a yard pastor, an ordained minister, who is a volunteer with special clearance from the prison administration to work with one yard of about 1,000 men or women pasturing that enclosure (yard).

Their mission is to bring inmates to the Lord and prepare them to make the right choices while inside so that, upon release, they are better able to lead productive lives. To date this ministry has saved the State of California at least \$12,500,000, cost of men who have been released and have stayed out, over the last fifteen years. Our God given goal is to spread the yard pastor approach to the 33 California State Prisons.

ISN involves 120 congregations of all denominations county-wide in a Rotational Shelter program. Congregations host the program in their facilities for two or four weeks a year providing volunteers for meals and overnight hosting, transportation and donations. Through neighborhood congregations linking with others, people are sheltered where there are no shelters and receive the understanding and support of congregations when previously all they knew was fear and uncertainty. Congregations benefit by getting to know homeless individuals personally and the mutual sharing of stories is beneficial to both. Guests move with the program from congregation to congregation staying in the program for up to 8 weeks [www.interfaithshelternetwork.org](http://www.interfaithshelternetwork.org).

La Jolla Presbyterian Church will host guests for two weeks in 2014 starting **Saturday, February 7 closing 2 weeks**

**later on Saturday, Feb. 20.** Guests join the program after being screened by professional staff at the Presbyterian Urban Ministries (another important Ministry partner of LJPC!) to assure there will be no active drug, alcohol or mental health problems. Guests who are admitted to the Interfaith Shelter Network Program must be willing to work closely with the counseling staff to resolve the problems leading to their homelessness. This is an effective, practical and manageable way to serve those in the homeless population who are looking for an opportunity to get out of their current situation. This is also a great family, Bible Study, Growth Group and/or community services project opportunity that will bless you as you are a blessing to others.

## ACTION INTERNATIONAL - Philippines

Drs. George and Anne Harper have served overseas training and mentoring seminary students since 1994. They are currently teaching at Asia Graduate School of Theology - Philippines (AGST). This is a consortium of nine evangelical seminaries which work together to offer advanced degrees. It is much cheaper to train Asians in Asia and not have them come to the West where they often choose to stay instead of returning to Asia. The church in Southeast Asia is exploding and so is the need for trained pastors, leaders, educators and missionaries. AGST draws students from across Southeast Asia including countries in the 10-40 window and closed to Western missionaries such as China and Myanmar. Most of the Harpers' students are extremely poor and need assistance even with the lower tuition and cost of living in Southeast Asia. They and their families make great sacrifices to pursue training.

## MALAWI

**Malawi** suffers from starvation, an AIDS/HIV epidemic and one of the highest levels of poverty and unemployment in Africa.

Seventy-four percent of the population lives below the international poverty line of \$1.25 a day. LJPC, in partnership with the **Central Church of Africa, Presbyterian (CCAP)** and World Vision is working through child sponsorships, evangelism, and support of the JMTI seminary to bring the hope of the gospel to central Malawi.

Over the past thirteen years, LJPC teams have been involved in everything from showing the Jesus Film in rural villages and renovating dorm rooms at the Malingundi Home and School for the Blind, to delivering books to the seminary library and playing soccer with children. In June 1013, a LJPC team partnered with a team from Lingadzi CCAP and worked at the Home and School for the Blind repairing broken windows and doors and putting in a drainage system for two showers. We saw the foundation for the duplex for seminarians LJPC and Lingadzi CCAP are sponsoring.

As we deepen our connection with **Lingadzi CCAP**, it becomes increasingly clear that, as a church, we have been called to participate in what God is doing for the people in the Warm Heart of Africa. Our projects are important.

Equally important are the friendships we've made with **Lingadzi CCAP** members. We are now in a covenant relation with that church. Monthly, groups in both congregations meet to pray for each other.

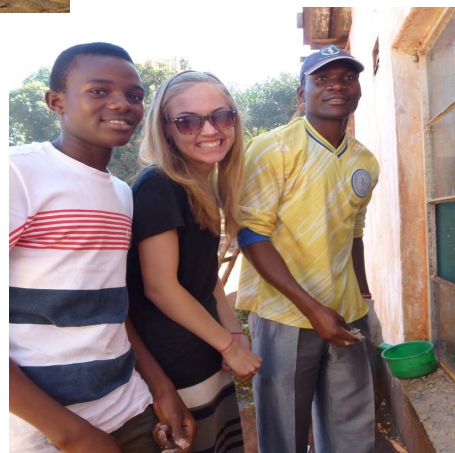
