FINANCIAL UPDATE: As we move into the final month of our fiscal budget 2016/17 we wanted to give you an update on where we stand. Expenses continue to be less than anticipated, but unfortunately our income is also running behind.

Budgeted Income Year to Date – \$2,140,000

Actual Income Year to Date – \$2,089,000

Shortfall Year to Date – \$51,000

Income for the month of June is budgeted at \$191,000. Thus, in order to meet our financial goal for 2017/18 we will need to receive \$242,000. The Elders are grateful for your continued generosity and are hopeful that we will be able to achieve our financial goal by the end of June.

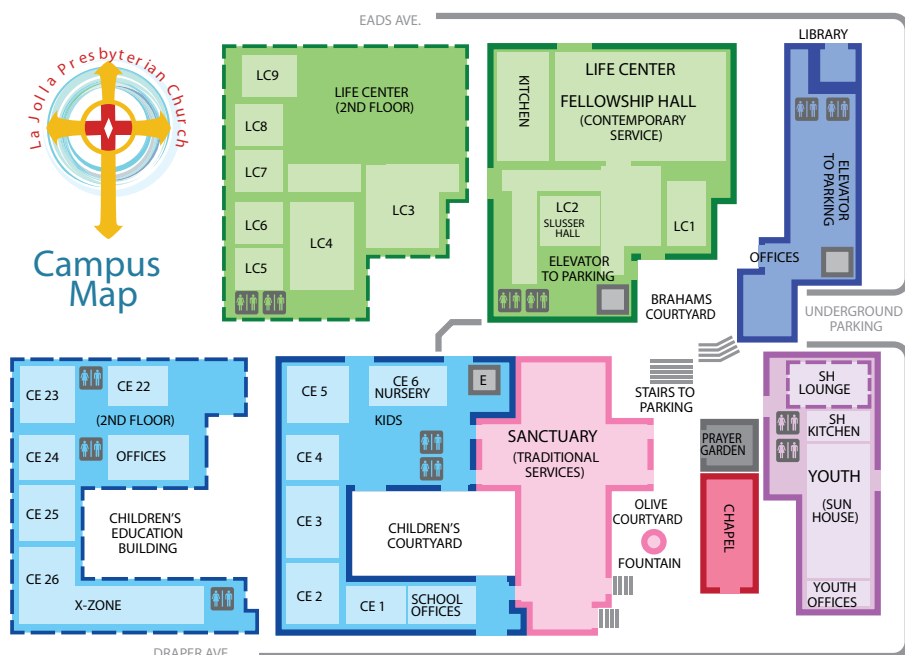

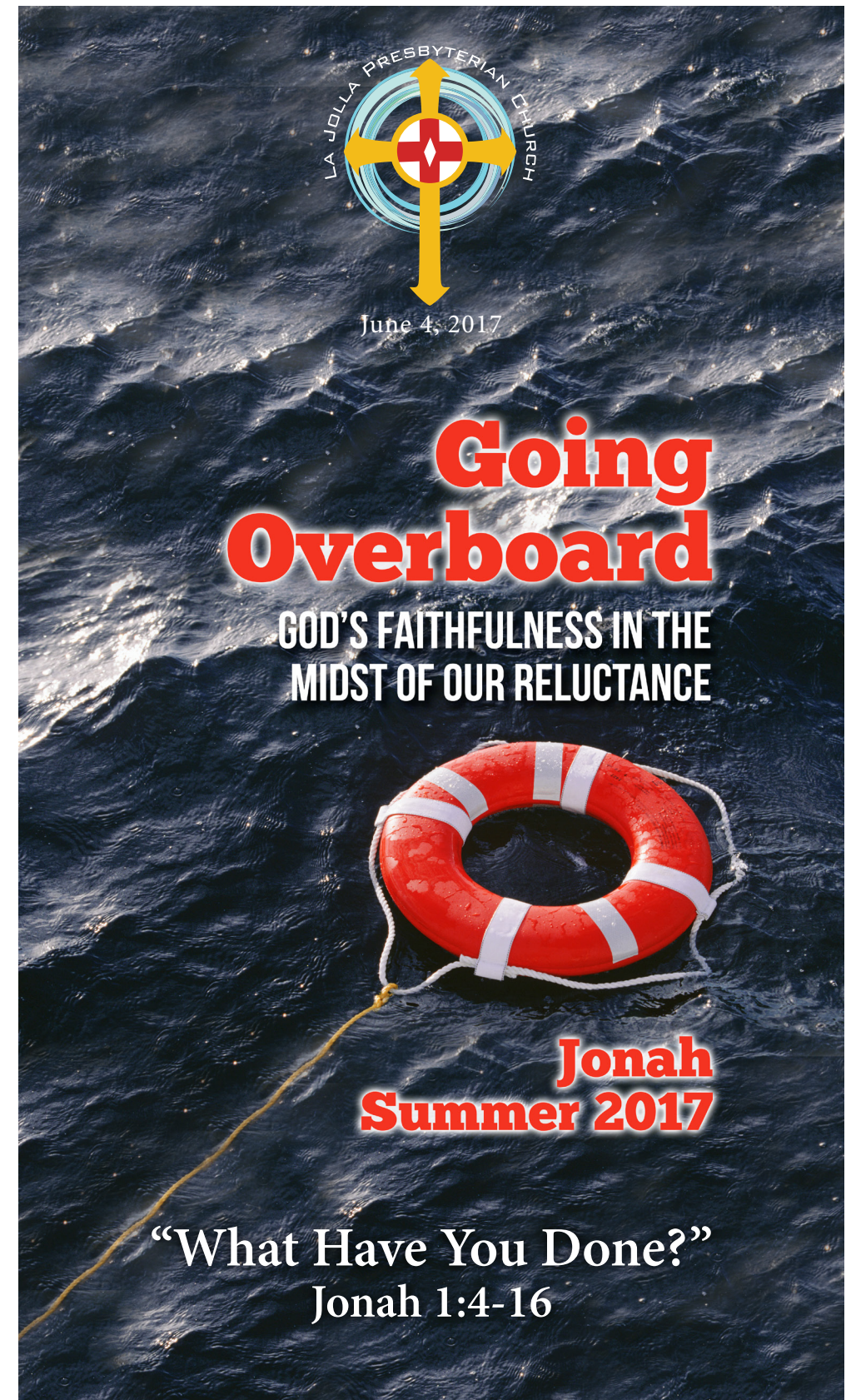
