At the end of April we were also running behind approximately \$80,000. Thus, we have some work to do in order to close this gap. We also know with God's faithfulness and your generosity, this is an achievable goal. Expenses continue to be in line with what we expected and are actually under budget. As always, the Elders are grateful for your faithful giving.
