





The English Second Language Classes aren't looking for financial gifts, but are always looking for new tutors. No experience is necessary, training and materials are provided.









Pastors to Prisoners provides "yard pastors" to assist Protestant institutional prison chaplains. The task of ministering to at least 5000 men held in five enclosures within the prison is a challenge that allows for the chaplain to spend two to three hours a week on each enclosure conducting inmate worship services, Bible studies, one-on-one counseling and mentoring, and supervising other chapel programs. Their mission is to bring inmates to the Lord, to evangelize all others in the prison yards while they are in prison, and prepare them to make the right choices while inside so that, upon or if released, they are better able to lead productive lives.








Every year in Malawi the hunger season brings suffering. So many, especially the women and small children, without food, hungry and hopeless. This year is projected to be one of the worst on record. We have tried each year to feed them. There must be a better way. We must find a long-term solution. The research shows that farming on a large scale will allow Malawians to feed themselves. A large farm can provide employment and jobs. In addition, it will provide on-going funding for the ministry and sharing about Jesus. That's why we are raising money to buy a farm.

- 1.. 173 acres has been identified as a good place to start.
- 2. Agriculture professionals have identified the land.
- 3. Professional managers have created a business plan.
- 4. Maize will be the first crop as this is the staple in Malawi.
- 5. The harvest can feed 1,750 families through the hunger season, about 9,000 people!
- 6. Some can also be sold, and the money used to expand the farm and support the ministry.
